Hello Summer!

It is so nice to have you back again! We are all enjoying the sunshine and warm weather. Even the occasional rain is ok, because we know our gardens and lawns need it to grow. All kidding aside, it felt like this winter and spring were particularly long. Continuing COVID unknowns and the search for an Interim Pastor, as well as other key church staff, added to our uncertainty. Jeremiah 29:11 reminds us to have hope in uncertain times... and what hope we have! What plans God must have for our future! We have been blessed with Pastor Rick Stein as our "Bridge Pastor" and we are doubly blessed that he has agreed to continue with us, serving as our Interim Pastor! Rev. Stein's love for God and love for people shines in his sermons, in his after-sermon sermons, and his one-on-one interactions. Our pews are filling up with both familiar and unfamiliar faces. We are praising God, talking, laughing, praying, singing, and enjoying each other's company again! God is filling us with new energy and excitement for the journey ahead.



Worship plans this summer are not finalized yet, but Pastor Stein is developing several shorter series that center on the ideas of Wilderness, Waiting, and Hope. These will begin about mid-June and continue throughout the summer. We hope to have at least one worship service outside, but have not yet chosen a date. We do know we will utilize the parking lot's flat surface as much as possible and try to provide as much shade as we can (and hopefully no rain!) Pentecost is June 5<sup>th</sup> this year. We will also be celebrating Communion, recognizing our amazing volunteers, and working to clean up our church grounds after worship. Please wear **RED** with your work clothes!

A change you will see beginning June 12<sup>th</sup> is that we will stop passing the offering plates and go back to leaving a plate outside the sanctuary for folks to use before entering. Offering will still be brought forward during the Doxology, followed by prayers of gratitude. We have had difficulty scheduling ushers for this task and find that many people give online, so we will be trying this method again. This change will be in effect through September 4<sup>th</sup>. Another change is a switch to a hybrid form of Communion, in June or July, dictated by current inventory of materials. We are planning to go back to plates with both bread and open cups of juice, as we have in the past, but will also offer a sealed, Gluten-free option. Intinction will proceed by going forward where you will be offered bread from a basket to be dipped in juice, or a Gluten-free, sealed container to be taken back in your pew. We have had a mix of desires expressed to both return to "real" bread and to maintain hygiene with the sealed containers, as well as to continue to honor those that may have hand tremors.

Opportunities abound to serve God through our church worship, from ushering, making coffee, and greeting, to offering special music and serving as worship assistant. Please see JoAnn Wainscott and she can find a place for you to serve!

As COVID variants increase, please note that masks are optional as we gather to worship. Masks and hand sanitizer are available in the entryway, narthex, sanctuary, and other locations within the church for your convenience. Please continue to lovingly respect the boundaries of others, as well as follow healthy practices of washing hands, using hand sanitizer, and staying home and/or masked when unwell.

# Pastor Rick

## Moving Forward

*“And after you have suffered for a little while, the God of all grace, who has called you to his eternal glory in Christ, will himself restore, support, strengthen, and establish you. To him be the power forever and ever. Amen.”*

First of all, a big THANK YOU! Thank you for allowing me the opportunity to be your Transitional Minister. It is truly an honor and I am humbled by the confidence you have expressed in me to help lead you on the journey that lies ahead.

This position was not on my radar when I was asked in November 2020 to be your Gap Pastor. In all honesty, I believed I would just fill in for a certain length of time and go quietly back into retirement. I should have known better.

In the last twenty-plus years, I have come to realize that whatever my “plans” were did not line up with the plan that God had for me. I could say that I was a slow learner but I think God showed me just one tiny step at a time of the journey that lay ahead. If God had showed me the whole picture at once, I would have freaked out and fought it tooth and nail. I would not have had the confidence in myself to make the complete journey that was planned for me.

God slowly led me on my journey one small step at a time. First, I began to take classes at Baldwin Wallace University to get my teaching certificate. Second, Mary and I returned to church after a 15 year absence and became very active. Third, I was a tutor at Midpark High School for a year. Fourth, I became the Christian Education Director at St. Andrew’s Presbyterian Church for two years, although I had no previous CE experience. Fifth, I had to change my life by getting clean and sober. Sixth, I attended seminary and got my Master of Divinity degree. Seventh, I was ordained and served as the Covenant Pastor at First United Presbyterian Church in Elyria.

After faithfully serving First United for 13+ years, I retired. Or so I thought.

You warmly embraced Mary and me when we arrived in January. When the Committee on Ministry called in late February to see how it was going the words just came out of my mouth, “Would I be able to apply for the Transitional Minister position?” Mary and I had not even discussed it; she did say she wasn’t surprised and gave me her blessing.

God granted me a first interview, which showed my interest but also my lack of experience for this job. God granted the HR Committee patience as they interviewed other candidates, knowing I was going to attend the transitional ministry class in Atlanta. The class was awesome and very informative. The patience shown by your committee and the confidence they showed in me in granting a second interview after the class was completely a God thing.

Now we begin to move forward. As I have personally learned, this will be an exciting journey; one that will take whatever time is necessary. We must be open to what God has planned for us. It will take a lot of prayer, a lot of work, a lot of prayer, a lot of patience, a lot of prayer, a lot of discussion, a lot of prayer, many meetings, a lot of prayer. I think we all get the picture.

I’m excited! I hope you are, too. God will be with us the whole time.

# HR Committee

We are blessed to announce that Pastor Rick Stein has accepted the position of Transitional Minister and Head of Staff for Avon Lake Presbyterian Church, effective May 16.

Pastor Rick has served as Gap Pastor of ALPC since January 2022, during which time he heard the call to Transitional Ministry and completed a week-long training course, which concluded on April 29. Prior to his time with ALPC, Pastor Rick served Covenant Pastor of First United Presbyterian in Elyria from 2007-2020. Before that, Rick obtained his Master of Divinity at Pittsburgh Theological Seminary and served as Chaplain at Southwest General Health Center and Director of Christian Education at St. Andrew's Presbyterian.

The process to call Pastor Rick as our Transitional Minister was long. The HR committee of ALPC session assembled an interview team including Bob Ralston, Lee Lohr, Cheryl Dean, Margre Lind, Marcy Uhl, Elizabeth Shoemaker, and Matt Wendling. This team took its responsibility seriously and prayerfully. Due diligence in selection of a Transitional Minister was followed, including consideration of candidates beyond Pastor Rick to learn about alternate views of Transitional Ministry and understand what capabilities other pastors apply to similar roles.

After following this process, the interview team unanimously recommended to ALPC Session to hire Rick Stein as our Transitional Minister. ALPC's calling of Rick Stein has been approved by both our Session and the Presbytery Committee on Ministry (COM).

Please join me in congratulating Pastor Rick in this new, expanded role as our Transitional Minister and Head of Staff. Please also join me in thanking God for bringing Pastor Rick to us and bringing ALPC to Pastor Rick.

Thank you, the congregation and staff of ALPC, for your trust and patience. Please pray for the Holy Spirit to continue to bless us by opening our ears, our minds, and our hearts to the work that God would have us do.

My husband had come home from the hospital the day before and nothing would do except to get winter tires on the car, so Saturday morning I made my way north 35 miles on I-79 to Sam's Club to get four new winter tires.

When I got up to the counter, I was told it would be at least four hours before they could take my car back to put on new tires. When I told him I would have to figure something else out because my husband couldn't be left alone that long. No tears, no explanation that if I got someone to stay with my husband, he usually sent them home once I was out of sight. No whining about the difficulties of recent months at work and home.

At any rate, the young man sensed my distress and asked me to step over to the next counter. I am not sure how he bumped me ahead, but he told me to come back in 45 minutes and he would see that I was taken care of.

Yes, I did feel a twinge of guilt about going ahead of people who would wait longer. Honestly though, it felt so good to be rescued. This happened 18 years ago and I am still grateful for that random act of kindness.

The Session met on May 16 – Highlights of their meeting were:

- We welcomed our incoming elders, Sue Mabe, David Brunner, and Sharon Call, and said farewell to our outgoing elders, Jim Janis, Kathy Leopold, and Susan Reighard.
- Learned the Deacons have had some new requests for rides to church.
- They are lending a hand to food missions, and church meals and celebrations.
- Session moved to allow eating indoors in case of bad weather, as long as tables are spaced, ventilation is increased, and awareness maintained regarding COVID-19 safety.
- Giving dropped significantly in May, though the budget is in good shape for the time being.
- The budget will be updated to reflect recent hires and project into the future.
- Members will be asked to keep up on their pledged giving through the summer.
- The onboarding process for new staff is being developed.
- This was Pastor Rick's first day as our transitional pastor.

- Learned there will be no youth mission trip this summer.

- The church brochures will be updated with new information on various church groups.
- A Google profile for the church will be created.
- Pastor Rick is planning three worship series this summer based on his interim training.
- Hybrid Communion will eventually be served with both packaged and unpackaged elements.
- Our worship volunteers will be recognized during the service on June 5.
- Pastor Rick shared his office hours and how he wants to meet with each elder individually to gain their insight on ALPC. He pledges to maintain confidentiality with all his conversations.





## Last Supper Cross Stitch—Gift to ALPC


